*(Everyone reads a verse in turn.)*

### **Psalm 71**

<sup>1</sup> In you, O LORD, I take refuge;  
let me never be put to shame.

<sup>2</sup> In your righteousness deliver me and rescue me;  
incline your ear to me and save me.

<sup>3</sup> Be to me a rock of refuge,  
a strong fortress, to save me,  
for you are my rock and my fortress.

<sup>4</sup> Rescue me, O my God, from the hand of the wicked,  
from the grasp of the unjust and cruel.

<sup>5</sup> For you, O Lord, are my hope,  
my trust, O LORD, from my youth.

<sup>6</sup> Upon you I have leaned from my birth;  
it was you who took me from my mother's womb.

My praise is continually of you.

<sup>7</sup> I have been like a portent to many,  
but you are my strong refuge.

<sup>8</sup> My mouth is filled with your praise,  
and with your glory all day long.

<sup>9</sup> Do not cast me off in the time of old age;  
do not forsake me when my strength is spent.

<sup>10</sup> For my enemies speak concerning me,  
and those who watch for my life consult together.

<sup>11</sup> They say, 'Pursue and seize that person  
whom God has forsaken,  
for there is no one to deliver.'

12 O God, do not be far from me;  
O my God, make haste to help me!  
13 Let my accusers be put to shame and consumed;  
let those who seek to hurt me  
be covered with scorn and disgrace.  
14 But I will hope continually,  
and will praise you yet more and more.  
15 My mouth will tell of your righteous acts,  
of your deeds of salvation all day long,  
though their number is past my knowledge.  
16 I will come praising the mighty deeds of the Lord GOD,  
I will praise your righteousness, yours alone.

17 O God, from my youth you have taught me,  
and I still proclaim your wondrous deeds.  
18 So even to old age and grey hairs,  
O God, do not forsake me,  
until I proclaim your might  
to all the generations to come.  
Your power <sup>19</sup>and your righteousness, O God,  
reach the high heavens.

You who have done great things,  
O God, who is like you?

20 You who have made me see many troubles and calamities  
will revive me again;  
from the depths of the earth  
you will bring me up again.  
21 You will increase my honour,  
and comfort me once again.

22 I will also praise you with the harp  
for your faithfulness, O my God;  
I will sing praises to you with the lyre,  
O Holy One of Israel.

- <sup>23</sup> My lips will shout for joy  
when I sing praises to you;  
my soul also, which you have rescued.
- <sup>24</sup> All day long my tongue will talk of your righteous help,  
for those who tried to do me harm  
have been put to shame, and disgraced.

## **Psalm 72**

Of Solomon.

- <sup>1</sup> Give the king your justice, O God,  
and your righteousness to a king's son.
- <sup>2</sup> May he judge your people with righteousness,  
and your poor with justice.
- <sup>3</sup> May the mountains yield prosperity for the people,  
and the hills, in righteousness.
- <sup>4</sup> May he defend the cause of the poor of the people,  
give deliverance to the needy,  
and crush the oppressor.
- <sup>5</sup> May he live while the sun endures,  
and as long as the moon, throughout all generations.
- <sup>6</sup> May he be like rain that falls on the mown grass,  
like showers that water the earth.
- <sup>7</sup> In his days may righteousness flourish  
and peace abound, until the moon is no more.
- <sup>8</sup> May he have dominion from sea to sea,  
and from the River to the ends of the earth.
- <sup>9</sup> May his foes bow down before him,  
and his enemies lick the dust.
- <sup>10</sup> May the kings of Tarshish and of the isles  
render him tribute,  
may the kings of Sheba and Seba  
bring gifts.
- <sup>11</sup> May all kings fall down before him,  
all nations give him service.

12 For he delivers the needy when they call,  
the poor and those who have no helper.  
13 He has pity on the weak and the needy,  
and saves the lives of the needy.  
14 From oppression and violence he redeems their life;  
and precious is their blood in his sight.

15 Long may he live!  
May gold of Sheba be given to him.  
May prayer be made for him continually,  
and blessings invoked for him all day long.  
16 May there be abundance of grain in the land;  
may it wave on the tops of the mountains;  
may its fruit be like Lebanon;  
and may people blossom in the cities  
like the grass of the field.  
17 May his name endure for ever,  
his fame continue as long as the sun.  
May all nations be blessed in him;  
may they pronounce him happy.

18 Blessed be the LORD, the God of Israel,  
who alone does wondrous things.  
19 Blessed be his glorious name for ever;  
may his glory fill the whole earth. Amen and Amen.

20 The prayers of David son of Jesse are ended.

### **First Lesson: Jonah 1:17 – 2:10**

Reader: A Reading from the Book of Jonah.

“17 But the LORD provided a large fish to swallow up Jonah; and Jonah was in the belly of the fish for three days and three nights.

**2** Then Jonah prayed to the LORD his God from the belly of the fish, <sup>2</sup>saying,  
‘I called to the LORD out of my distress,  
and he answered me;  
out of the belly of Sheol I cried,  
and you heard my voice.  
<sup>3</sup> You cast me into the deep,  
into the heart of the seas,  
and the flood surrounded me;  
all your waves and your billows  
passed over me.  
<sup>4</sup> Then I said, “I am driven away  
from your sight;  
how shall I look again  
upon your holy temple?”  
<sup>5</sup> The waters closed in over me;  
the deep surrounded me;  
weeds were wrapped around my head  
<sup>6</sup> at the roots of the mountains.  
I went down to the land  
whose bars closed upon me for ever;  
yet you brought up my life from the Pit,  
O LORD my God.  
<sup>7</sup> As my life was ebbing away,  
I remembered the LORD;  
and my prayer came to you,  
into your holy temple.  
<sup>8</sup> Those who worship vain idols  
forsake their true loyalty.  
<sup>9</sup> But I with the voice of thanksgiving  
will sacrifice to you;  
what I have vowed I will pay.  
Deliverance belongs to the LORD!’  
<sup>10</sup> Then the LORD spoke to the fish, and it spewed Jonah out upon the  
dry land.”

Reader: Here ends the Lesson.

**A Song of Praise** *Benedictus es, Domine*

- \* Glory to you, Lord God of our fathers;

**Second Lesson: Acts 27:9 - 26**

Reader: A Reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles.

“9 Since much time had been lost and sailing was now dangerous, because even the Fast had already gone by, Paul advised them, <sup>10</sup>saying, ‘Sirs, I can see that the voyage will be with danger and much heavy loss, not only of the cargo and the ship, but also of our lives.’ <sup>11</sup>But the centurion paid more attention to the pilot and to the owner of the ship than to what Paul said. <sup>12</sup>Since the harbour was not suitable for spending the winter, the majority was in favour of putting to sea from there, on the chance that somehow they could reach Phoenix, where they could spend the winter. It was a harbour of Crete, facing south-west and north-west.

<sup>13</sup> When a moderate south wind began to blow, they thought they could achieve their purpose; so they weighed anchor and began to sail past Crete, close to the shore. <sup>14</sup>But soon a violent wind, called the northeaster, rushed down from Crete. <sup>15</sup>Since the ship was caught and could not be turned with its head to the wind, we gave way to it and were driven. <sup>16</sup>By running under the lee of a small island called Cauda we were scarcely able to get the ship’s boat

under control. <sup>17</sup>After hoisting it up they took measures to undergird the ship; then, fearing that they would run on the Syrtis, they lowered the sea-anchor and so were driven. <sup>18</sup>We were being pounded by the storm so violently that on the next day they began to throw the cargo overboard, <sup>19</sup>and on the third day with their own hands they threw the ship's tackle overboard. <sup>20</sup>When neither sun nor stars appeared for many days, and no small tempest raged, all hope of our being saved was at last abandoned.

21 Since they had been without food for a long time, Paul then stood up among them and said, 'Men, you should have listened to me and not have set sail from Crete and thereby avoided this damage and loss. <sup>22</sup>I urge you now to keep up your courage, for there will be no loss of life among you, but only of the ship. <sup>23</sup>For last night there stood by me an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I worship, <sup>24</sup>and he said, "Do not be afraid, Paul; you must stand before the emperor; and indeed, God has granted safety to all those who are sailing with you." <sup>25</sup>So keep up your courage, men, for I have faith in God that it will be exactly as I have been told. <sup>26</sup>But we will have to run aground on some island."

Reader: Here ends the reading.
