Jesus said, "I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you - - you of little faith? Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."

The congregation being seated, all members who participate in worship (altar guild, lectors, ushers, servers, acolytes, etc) come forward to stand with the celebrant in full view of the people.

Celebrant: Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus, we are all baptized by the one Spirit into one Body, and given gifts for a variety of ministries for the common good. The word liturgy comes from the Greek meaning "the people's work." Our purpose today is to lift up the ministry of the faithful hands and voices of our parishioners who work so diligently on behalf of God to benefit the liturgy here at St. John's. From our dedicated altar guild servers who take care of this sacred space, readying it for worship, to the ushers who exhibit welcome and hospitality to

all who worship here, let us give thanks for the many liturgical leaders who serve God and St. John's.

Celebrant to the Liturgical Leaders: You have been called to a ministry in this congregation. Will you faithfully and reverently execute the duties of your ministry to the honor of God and for the benefit of this congregation?

Liturgical Leaders: I will.

Celebrant: Let us pray. Eternal God, you accepted the service of Levites in your temple, and your Son was pleased to accept the loving service of his friends: Bless the ministry of these persons and give them grace. Bless our **Altar Guild**, that may they make the sanctuary glorious with their efforts as they care for the vessels and vestments that adorn this church. Bless all who serve at the altar, that they may do so with in reverence and holiness. Give grace to the singers in your Church, that with hymns and spiritual songs they may make music to the glory of your Name. Look graciously upon the lectors who lift their voice up to you; enlighten them with wisdom and understanding as they read your holy Word. Bless all who serve St. John's to be your hands and heart and feet to this world. **Amen.**

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with John and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *Amen*.
