
## HAVE YOU CHECKED OUT OUR UPDATED WEBSITE?

#### RENOVATIONS UPDATE

Update on Parish Hall Renovation Project

The current Phase 3 and final phase of the Parish Hall Renovation Project is almost complete. Final trim work is all that is needed to complete this phase. The total scope of the project includes the following:

Construction of an ADA compliant and handicap accessible walkway that extends across the front of the Parish Hall.

Replacement of the original wall of windows across the front of the building with new energy efficient and attractive windows.

Reconfiguration and enlargement of the clergy office with private direct outside access.

Reconfiguration and enlargement of the administrative assistant's office providing direct access to a new reception area and improved functionality.

Installation of new energy efficient HVAC to the office area.

New ADA compliant front doors to the Parish Hall.

A new wall and attractive landscaping for the front of the building complementing the

new walkway and entrances.

A new dish storage room, part of Phase 2, was also completed and a new dish trolley was purchased that adds storage and convenience.

This work was completed at an approximate cost of \$200,000. Approximately \$175,000 of this cost came from pledges from individuals in the parish. If you would like to make a donation to close the gap, please speak with Rev. Jill or Paul Costello. The remaining funds will come from church accounts.

This will complete the final work of the Parish Hall Renovation begun back in 2016. During that time, the Parish Hall has undergone a complete upgrade with new HVAC, handicap accessible restrooms, upgraded windows, new rooms, and upgraded floors, ceilings and lighting in much of the building. This work was completed at a total cost of approximately \$1,000,000. Almost all of this money came from donations from individuals in the parish and bequests. Our church has truly been blessed to be able to accomplish this work without having to borrow money. Thank you to all who have contributed to make this a success.

## YOUTH GROUP NEWS

The Youth Group has been busy this summer and we have great plans for the Fall. On August 10th, 14 of us volunteered at the Brandywine SPCA. On August 19th, St. John's held a lock-in for our youth. The Lynams hosted swimming in the afternoon and then we



went to the Parish Hall for games and food. Playing Grogg in the dark basement of the Parish Hall was a hit! The youth started cleaning and painting the Youth Room this month, too. While the painting is not quite finished, the room looks great so far.

This year, our Youth Group will meet the 2nd and 4th Sundays of month and will volunteer with other organizations throughout the year. We have plans to feed the homeless, pack Thanksgiving dinners at Chester Eastside, bake cookies for our home-bound parishioners, and distribute blankets in the winter. We also plan to begin fundraising for a future trip to Guatemala; look out for news about car washes, bake sales and more.

Being a 4th or 5th grader is not always easy: they feel too old for "little kids' stuff," but they aren't quite ready for the social world of preteen or high school life. #### **STEWARDSHIP**

#### "Growing God's Kingdom"

Our fall Stewardship Campaign for 2023 is about to kick off with the theme of *Growing God's Kingdom*. We believe that we are a parish that offers so much to our community – but we can grow more fully into the people God calls us to be.

One bountiful area where Stewardship has allowed us to *Grow God's Kingdom* is in the renewed growth of our Youth Group and its activities, reaching more than a dozen preteens and teens in our parish. Looking forward, Rev. Jill and parishioner Jacqui Dunn will plant a new youth program for children in grades 4 and 5 (see "Club 54" p. 7 for more information). Christian Ed Director Margie Hatcher and our Sunday School volunteers sow seeds of God's love every Sunday with Children's Chapel and Sunday School teachings which root the message of God's belovedness deep in our children's hearts.

Much growth will happen this coming year as we reimagine our music program, enhance our live stream capabilities, host various fellowship and education programs, and continue enhancing our spiritual and fellowship opportunities to our entire congregation.

The recent renovations that have taken place at St. John's has created much fertile space to *Grow God's Kingdom*. We've renewed our facilities with completely new offices and enhanced meeting rooms in our parish hall, and, of course, a remodeled rectory for Rev. Jill and her family. We have received many compliments on our new facilities from the Diocese as well as the community groups who use our space, such as AA, NA, the Girl Scouts and the Boy Scouts; our plan is to continue to grow these assets to meet both the spiritual and social needs of our parish.

It takes over \$300,000 annually to operate our parish at its current level. Your individual pledges fund most of that income and are used to support our activities such as Sunday services, Sunday School, pastoral care, as well as our outreach programs for Chester Eastside and Guatemala. Your contributions provide for salaries of our Rector and staff, pay for insurance, taxes (yes, we do pay property taxes), utilities, office expenses and equipment. Running St. John's is just like a business. These expenses are detailed in the Annual Report so you can see how your financial contributions are used. (Contact the Parish Office for a copy of the 2021 Annual Report or view it now on the website under the 'Growing' tab.)

Stewardship also involves a considerable number of gardeners who are willing to sow seeds for God's Kingdom. Last year we estimated that 4400 individual hours were spent by parishioners who are actively involved in our parish life including fellowship opportunities, outreach, property management, treasury/finance, Vestry, administration and many others. And, we can always use more gardeners: consider what time and talent you may be able to provide.

Our 2023 Stewardship Campaign with begin this September. Think about what St. John's means to you and your family. Your annual pledge is critical to our planning for the upcoming year. Also please consider a pledge increase: a 5% addition to your annual financial commitment will go a long way in *Growing God's Kingdom*.
